

<u>Pre-Chiropractic Advising Sheet</u>

A chiropractor is a health care professional focused on the diagnosis and treatment of neuromuscular disorders, with an emphasis on treatment through *manual adjustment and/or manipulation of the spine*. Admission prerequisites vary by institution. Some schools will not accept AP credit for prerequisites. Check requirements for each program carefully. Usually, 24 semester units of life/physical sciences are required. Here are the recommendations:
