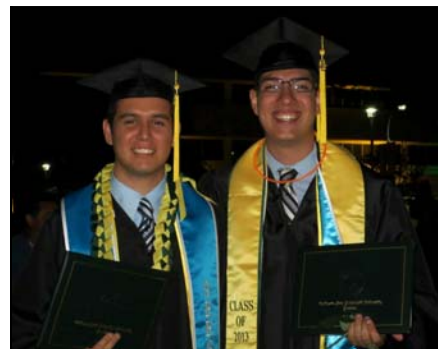

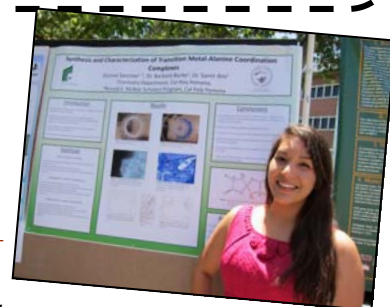

8th Annual College of Science Research Symposium

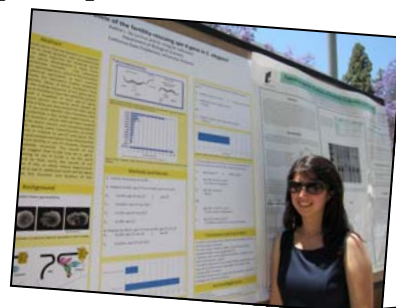


More than 80 science students, including 15
