



Pre-Physician Assistant Advising Sheet

Physician assistants are trained to perform under the supervision of a physician many clinical procedures traditionally performed by a physician. They are educated as generalists in medicine, and their education and credentialing are based on primary care foundation, which gives them flexibility to be employed in all areas of medicine. Most PA programs award a Master's degree and the average length is 27 months. PAs are required to complete hours in basic sciences, pharmacology, behavioral sciences, and clinical medicine. They also need to complete a clinical rotation with an emphasis on primary care in various types of facilities. All states require that PA's graduate from an accredited PA program and are required to pass the Physician Assistant National Certifying Examination (PANCE) certified by the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants (NCCPA).
