Training in these skills is called for by the University and College mission statements. Philosophy equips students with lifelong learning skills. These skills include creativ and critical thinking processes enabling both qualitative and quantitative reasoning; the application of theory to practice, and written and oral communication skills. The Cal Poly Pomona Philosophy Department is distinctive in combining the role of developing critical thinking and verbal skills with philosophy's role of synthesis to include a strikingly outward-looking perspective with respect to the University as a whole as well as the communi The Department embraces the objectives of a traditional philosophical education while also seeking to enhance core student skills (critical thinking, written argumentation). Program Objectives of the Law & Society Option is to provide students with a solid background in philosophy with special emphasis upon the application of critical thinking skills to moral, social and political issues in the law, medicine, the environment, and education. In addition, the Opti endeavors to equip students with the tools needed to analyze legal or moral concepts and arguments, and to work toward reasonable solutions to societal problems.
