- Most recent graduation rates show very promising trends.



Cal Poly Pomona Graduation Rates for Freshman and Transfer Students







CPP Non-URM and URM Graduation Rates for Freshman and Transfer Students

Graduation Initiative 2025 One-Time Funds in 2016-17

- \$35 million to CSU
 - \$1.2 million to Cal Poly Pomona
- Planned expenditure of one-time funds in support of student success
 - Additional funding for high-demand bottleneck courses
 - Funding to address courses with high D/U/F rates
 - Faculty data champions and other approaches to enable data-informed decisions
 - Develop and implement critical roadmaps (2 year and 4 year) for each major
 - Campaign to increase the number of units students take each term
