BACKGROUND: The Department of Education in the College of Education and Integrative Studies has put forward a referral for a revised semester version of the Preliminary Education Specialist Credential—Mild Moderate Disabilities. This is a revised program to provide students with more targeted content in mild/moderate disabilities and to reduce redundancy in content across courses. One new course, Characteristics of and Instructional Strategies for Students with Mild/Moderate Disabilities (EDU 5310) was created and three prerequisite courses from the program were removed (TED 406; GED 400; EDS 403). The content of these courses has been embedded in other courses (EDU 5000; EDU 5310). Rather than have a separate technology course, educational uses of educational technologies have been embedded in methods courses to demonstrate effective strategies for the K-12 classroom. The program offerings meet all State of California Commission on Teacher Credentialing Standards and Teaching Performance Expectations, as well as the Common Core State Standards.

DISCUSSION:

Before reaching the Academic Programs Committee, this program was reviewed by the Department of Education Curriculum Committee in the College of Education and Integrative Studies, as well as the Dean of the College of Education and Integrative Studies and the Office of Academic Programs. All concerns raised at those levels were addressed. The Academic Programs Committee then conducted campus-wide consultation, as well as its own review of the program. No concerns were raised.
