First Reading

BACKGROUND:

In Fall 2014 the faculty of English and Foreign Languages began working on a name change proposal by setting up an ad hoc committee of faculty to make recommendations to the department as a whole. In Spring 2016 faculty voted unanimously to change the department's name from English and Foreign Languages to English and Modern Languages.

This change was designed to coincide with semester conversion, and to reflect the content of redesigned departmental programs under semesters. The department's current name is not representative of the teaching and scholarship of the department, and is out of step with academic trends nationally and within California.

Due to the multilingual and multicultural student population of Cal Poly Pomona, many students in CPP's Spanish, Chinese, French, and German courses are not studying those languages as a foreign language, but, rather, as their first or heritage language. The adjective modern is neutral in this regard and, as a consequence, more inclusive of all the perspectives in which these languages are taught. This name change is consistent with a national trend (i.e. for more information please visit: https://www.insidehighered.com/news/2011/10/05/colleges_are_replacing_foreign_language_departments by which many departments have abandoned the term "foreign" for more terms like "modern" or "world" (Jaschik, "Not So Foreign Languages," Inside Higher Education, 5 Oct. 2011), and evident in the fact that all but two CSU campuses have followed suit.
