

Campus Preparation (March – October, 2019)


- Lines of Inquiry

- Prepare groups and individuals that will meet with team during visit.





- The Office of Student Success will work with campus partners to help students throughout their first year.






CPP Connect

- Common advising/tutoring notetaking system.
- Currently available to college staff advisors, the Bronco Advising Center & Learning Resource Center.
- Next phases:
 - Expand to faculty & other campus partners.
 - Predictive analytics.





Summer Completion Grant Initiative 2019

- Eligible students will receive funding for up to 8 units, including mandatory educational support fees.
 - If funding is available, students may be eligible for up to \$175 in textbook credit.
 - Students may also be eligible for other types of financial aid (Pell Grant and loans).
- 2,877 students within 8 semester units of graduating received email on March 21, 2019 with invitation to apply.
- Students must enroll in courses they need to graduate in summer 2019, update their MyPlanner, apply for summer 2019 graduation and apply for the grant online.
