Courses TH 1250 and TH 1250A were previously taught as a lecture/activity (3/1 units) under the quarter system. There was an error in converting the original theater courses and the activity was not converted. The Department of Theater and New Dance is requesting to modify the lecture course to make it two units and add a co-requisite activity as one unit. These courses have been in Curriculog since November 2018 and were late in getting to the Academic Senate, therefore the waiver is requested to get the courses in the fall 2019 catalog.
