WHEREAS, Evelyn Tratnyek has served the Education Department for twenty-seven years as an adjunct lecturer in the College of Education and Integrative Studies; and

WHEREAS, She has faithfully served as a Clinical Practice Supervisor for dozens of teacher candidates, providing professional guidance and support to help teacher candidates obtain their teaching credentials; and

WHEREAS, She served as a reading consultant, elementary teacher, and science mentor in K-12 schools; and

WHEREAS, She served in the Clinical Practice Curriculum Creation and PLC where she trained in the California Teacher center, modified and adopted the testing models for the teacher performance expectations and assessments; and

WHEREAS, She created, modified and piloted tools, assessments and evaluations, adopting and setting timelines for teacher candidates in Blocks I and II of their field experiences; and

WHEREAS, She interviewed prospective teacher candidates into the credential program; and

WHEREAS, She observed, guided, mentored, and taught future teachers, working with cooperating teachers and principals in the field; and

WHEREAS, She supported co-teaching efforts in the classroom and provided recommendations to school districts and principals for purposes of employment of current and former student teachers; and therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Academic Senate of California State Polytechnic University, Pomona, unanimously express its genuine appreciation for her nearly three decades of dedicated guidance and service to our teacher candidates, Master teachers, and her colleagues at this University and in the Education Department; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the title of “Lecturer Emeritus” be bestowed upon her; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to Lecturer Evelyn Barlow Tratnyek in recognition of her ability to touch the future of our teaching profession in California by her sustained commitment to K-12 students, teacher candidates, and the teaching profession and that it be permanently recorded in the Minutes and Archives of the Academic Senate.
