
Current LA County Metrics as of 2/9/21

- 1. 3,353 new cases and 1,152,239 total cases reported
- 2. 227 new deaths and 18,363 total deaths reported
- 3. 4,079 people currently hospitalized with COVID-19; 29% are in the ICU; 7,253 hospitalized on 1/20.
- 4. 5,622,000 individuals tested to date with 19% of people testing positive.
- 5. 10.6% ICU capacity remaining in the Southern California Region. (46.3% 4-week (March 8) Projected ICU Capacity.)

Points of Note

- In the state of CA 2 cases of the B.1.351 (South African variant) have been identified, one in Alameda and the other in Santa Clara.
- LACDPH has confirmed 5 additional cases of COVID-19 variant B.1.1.7. (U.K. variant) totaling 8 cases in LAC.

Updates for IHEs: Expect updated guidance in mid-March.

 - Residential and inpatient mental health facilities



Healthcare Workers in:

- Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) contracted Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Programs (STRTP) and Transitional Shelter Care Program Facilities (TSCF)
- Department of Mental Health
- Home healthcare organizations and home health agencies (in-home supportive service personnel)
- Intermediate care facilities (for persons who need non-continuous nursing supervision and supportive care)
- Outpatient substance use disorder (SUD) treatment, mental health facilities, and crisis stabilization units
- Public Health field staff who have face to face contact with patients/public (e.g. during testing, contact tracing, outbreak investigations)
- Primary care clinics, including Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs), rural health centers, and correctional facility clinics
- Urgent care clinics
- Office of Diversion and Re-entry (ODR)
- Medical shelters
- Sheltered and Unsheltered settings who are providing direct clinical care for people experiencing homelessness
- Field-based community health workers, including promotoras (including those involved with testing, contact tracing, or supportive services to persons with suspected or confirmed COVID-19)
- Regional Centers





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Points of Note



- 1. Vaccination Hub opened on **Friday, Feb. 5**; it will be <u>open 7 days a week, from 8 a.m. to 6</u> <u>p.m</u>. (subject to vaccine availability).
- 2. A consortium of health organizations, led by Kaiser Permanente, is operating the hub.
- 3. Appointments can be made on California's MyTurn website (<u>https://myturn.ca.gov</u>)
 - a. Website checks eligibility in accordance with State's priority framework and not restricted to Kaiser members.
 - b. CPP Vaccination Hub not limited those who work/live in Los Angeles County
 - c. Appointments added regularly.
 - d. Recommend signing up to be informed when *it's your turn*.
- 4. Campus continuing to work to enhance communication, wayfinding, and access for those eligible.
