Los Angeles County is currently in the Minimal (Yellow) Tier Status.

* Adjusted: 7-day average of daily COVID-19 cases per 100K with 7-day lag, adjusted for number of tests perform.



Current LA County Metrics as of 5/4/21

- 1. 273 new cases and 1,234,202 total cases reported
- 2. 18 new deaths and 23,930 total deaths reported
- 3. 386 people currently hospitalized with COVID-19; 25% are in the ICU
- 4. 6,525,000 individuals tested to date with 18% of people testing positive.
- On May 4, Los Angeles County met the threshold for the next tier Tier 4 (Yellow, Minimal).
 The modified Health Officer Order will be effective on May 6.

Points of Note

- California's coronavirus 7-day case rate now the lowest in the U.S and has the lowest
 positivity rate compared to any other state in the country and is lower than only 6 other
 nations in the world.
- On June 15, California will move beyond the blueprint and fully reopen (with reasonable risk mitigation efforts) if vaccine supply remains consistent and hospitalizations remain stable and low.
- LACDPH has not yet made determinations for beyond June 15 and can continue to have stricter measures in place.




