The problem:

Impacts of food & housing insecurity on learning & progress

- Lower GPAs
- Reduced concentration, higher levels of depression and anxiety
- Greater academic stress reported
- More likely to drop classes
- Less likely to participate in co-curricular activities
- Reduced retention and return in future terms



CSU Basic Needs Study

(Crutchfield & Maguire, 2018)

- **35.9%** of CPP Students reported *food insecurity*
- **14.9%** of CPP Students reported being *homeless at least once within the last 12 months*

Food Resources



- Poly Pantry 2 Go- curbside pickup
- CalFresh Outreach & Assistance
- Meal Assistance Program
- EBT Access on Campus (Farm Store)

Financial Assistance and Support



- \$500 Emergency Grant for crisis/emergencies
- Career Clothes Closet Stipend
- Linkage with Financial Aid and other campus resources
- Education on financial resources and building budgets

Housing Resources



- Emergency Housing (7-14 days)
- Hotel Vouchers for students with families (7-14 days)
- College Focused Rapid Rehousing
- Linkage to community resources

Holistic Support



- Follow academic achievement of students and focus on supporting them through a holistic wraparound approach within the Integrated Care Network.
- Full time Care Services Coordinator to assist with support and linkage to campus and community resources (Dr. CL)

Signs of food or housing insecurity

Face to face

- Students express concern over food
- Students fall asleep in class
- Students stay behind after an evening class
- Students shower in campus facilities
- Students suddenly seem disengaged
- Significant grade difference
- Abnormal attendance patterns

Remote

- Students express concern over food
- Students suddenly seem disengaged
- Significant grade difference
- Abnormal attendance patterns
- Missing assignments, lots of late assignments
- Emails from students

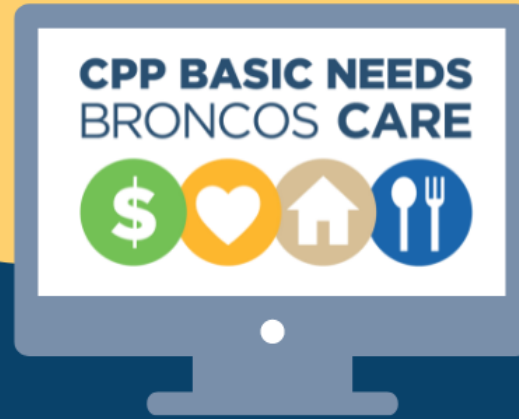
