Enrollment Management & Services

Transfer Success Pathway (TSP)

- Included in Postsecondary Education Trailer Bill AB 132 (July 2021)
 - ✓ Requires both the CSU and UC to begin the program starting the 2023-24 academic year
 - ✓ First-time freshman who graduated or left HS in spring 2023
- Guarantees that participating students will be admitted to the university in a future term.
- Specific campus & program will be selected by students at time of agreement.
- Impacted programs may specify supplementary criteria, such as GPA, major-specific GPA.
- ADT units and requirements cannot be altered, and ADT students cannot be asked to complete any additional coursework above TMC.

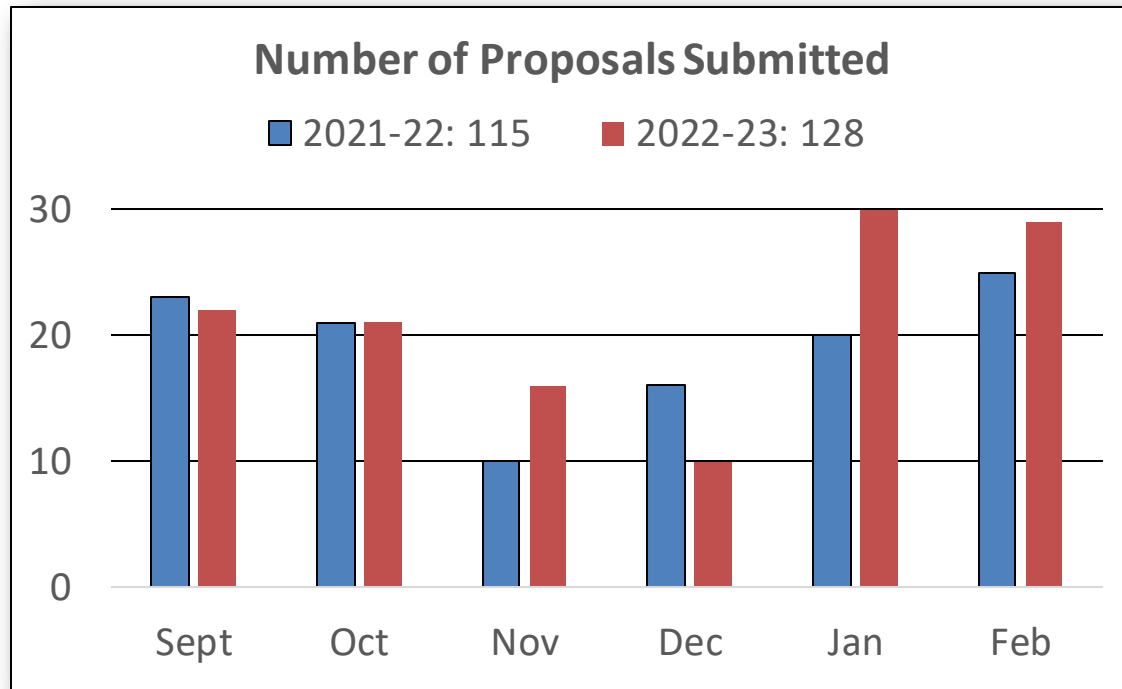
Transfer Success Pathway (TSP)

- As not to cause confusion with dual enrollment programs, the CSU dual admissions program is officially named the **Transfer Success Pathway (TSP)**.
- Allows high school students, graduating in 2023 and beyond, to attend a California Community College (CCC) and subsequently enter into an agreement with a specific CSU in a specific program with the intent to transfer within three years.
- The TSP program provides an opportunity to support future transfer students and provides a greater opportunity to establish stronger relationships with students while enrolled at community colleges.

Early Alerts

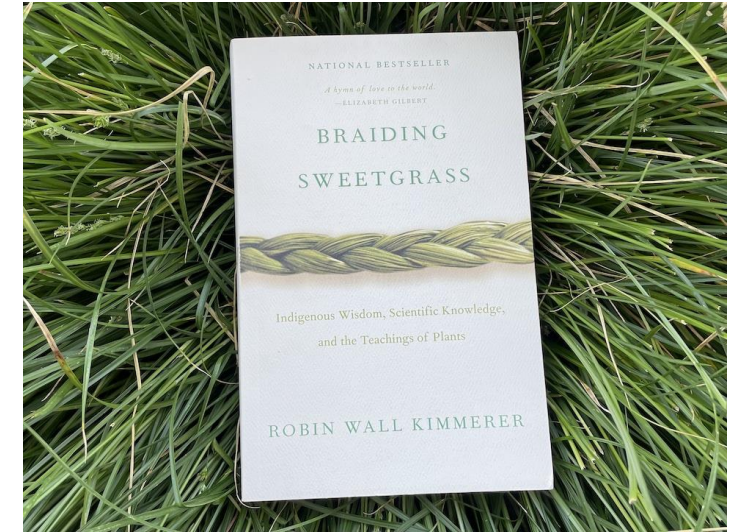
- Faculty are invited to submit early alerts for students who may need support in your class. There will be two opportunities throughout the semester.
