ASCSU report to Cal Poly Pomona Academic Senate

The ASCSU met 15-17 March, adopting for the first time a hybrid format.

The ASCSU had visits from EVC Alva, CSU Dominguez Hill President Thomas A. Parham, Interim CSU Chancellor Jolene Koester, Trustees Lateefah Simon and Wenda Fong, CFA President Charles Toombs, and CSSA VP of Systemwide Affairs Dixie Samaniego, Al Liddicoat (on the Mercer Faculty Compensation Study)

- 1. EVC Alva discussed:
 - a. the shift on vaccinations from being requiremed to recommended for the CSU community, noting that individual campuses can, in consultation with the CO, add requirements for students in dorms or specific learning environments. The logic offered was that registration holds represent obstacles to student success.
 - b. Concerns with the moves by some CCCs to move forward on baccalaureate degrees even when CSUs have objected.
 - c. Her interest in moving towards having all CSU GE align with Cal-GETC. ASCSU senators enumerated concerns in response: the inadvisability of making CSU GE require UC eligibility requirements; the movement of curriculum outside of CSU control; the fact that multiple GE patterns have always (and will continue) to exist; catalog rights; the cost of any change; difficulties in ADT awarding if it can vary by UC vs. CSU version of Cal-GETC.
- 2. President Parham spoke to the critical role the ASCSU has in addressing Black student success, and challenges regarding unwelcoming environments on CSU campuses. He offered three strategies for moving forward: Strategy 1: be provocative, Strategy 2: embrace synthesis of the sobering message and motivation to engage in change, Strategy 3: encourage ASCSU senators/all faculty to commit to making a single change in behavior to contribute to student success. His presentation was very inspiring, and was followed by vigorous discussion.
- 3. Interim CSU Chancellor Jolene Koester reinforced some of EVC Alva's message, mentioned that Cozen-O'Conner reports for each campus should be published in April, and that a formal report is expected to go to the BoT in May.
- 4. Al Liddicoat spent a great deal of time telling the body very little about the Mercer Faculty Compensation Study, as the real report would be presented at the BoT meeting the following week.

The ASCSU completed its process of choosing candidates to recommend to the Governor for the position of Faculty Trustee. These faculty were recommended to Governor Newsom:

- Dr. Romey Sabalius (current faculty trustee, Faculty at SJSU)
- Dr. Darlene Yee-Melichar (current ASCSU senator, Faculty at SFSU)
