Written Communication Assessment 2022 – 2023

- Collecting student artifacts from 3000- & 4000-level courses
 - Approx. 2 10 pages in length
 - Individually written (i.e., not a group paper)
 - Addresses the four categories of the university rubric:

Context & Purpose for Writing	addresses audience, purpose & context
Organization	ideas & concepts are organized
Development	advances ideas using compelling & relevant narratives
Clarity & Grammar	use of grammar tools to communicate

Enrollment Management & Services

- On October 1, the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships kicked off the start of the new scholarship cycle.
- There were over **300 scholarship opportunities** published on opening day, with an additional 60 opportunities since then, representing an increase of more than **1,000% compared to last year.**
- This is the highest number of opportunities ever on the opening day of the cycle!
- Current fund balances have us on track to award nearly \$3.5 million this cycle.










