Fall 2023 Admission Update

Goal of 4,600 freshmen and 3,000 transfers

- As of February 13, we have admitted 30,924 freshmen
 - ✓ All non-impacted majors except for music (deadline 2/17)
 - ✓ Waitlisted 1,569 students
 - ✓ Initiated **CPP Choice** process in waves starting on February 10
- January 31 Transfer update file closes (fall grades)
 - ✓ February 10 164 Architecture admits (7 deposits)
 - ✓ Week of February 13 Admit applicants to non-impacted majors
 - ✓ February 27 Admit applicants to impacted majors
- April 1 CSU deadline to finalize all undergraduate decisions
- May 1 National intent deadline




- Cal Poly Pomona receives more undergraduate admission applications than we can accommodate.
 - Unfortunately, most of the applications are high-demand programs with limited capacities, such as Computer Science. Over 60% of our undergraduate applications are for high-demand majors.
 - Programs that have the desire and room to grow do not have the applicant pool to meet their enrollment goals.



- CSU-eligible First-Time Freshmen that cannot be accommodated (due to space) in their first-choice major will be sent an email on behalf of the college dean about similar majors with capacity.
- Email will invite CPP Choice applicants to consider changing their major to other programs with the capacity that meets their interests and/or career goals.
- FTF students that choose to change their major will be automatically admitted into the new major.
- Admitting more students into programs with capacity will reduce the number of students we need to admit into impacted programs to meet our overall FTF enrollment target.





- Over 9,500 FTF applicants were eligible for CPP Choice.
- Due to the large number of eligible students, we are offering CPP Choice in waves. The first wave of 452 offers went out on Friday, February 10.
- Depending upon the response/acceptance, we will determine how many other students will be offered CPP Choice to meet our FTF enrollment goal of 4,600.

Minimum required by CBA: 25 Semester Sabbaticals



Research, Innovation, and Economic Development

Faculty Research Fellows

- One in each college faculty with experience in grants, IRB, IACUC
- Assist colleagues with:
 - Identifying collaborators and funding opportunities
 - Drafting grants budget, narrative, etc.
 - Managing grants with CPP Foundation
 - IRB/IACUC protocols
 - New(er) faculty mentoring
- Receive assigned time, stipend, or other support as appropriate

Operational Plan for MOUs and Agreements

- Only the President and CFO/VP for Administration have the authority to enter into agreements
- College Deans act as PI or lead and work with ORIED where a review of the agreement by relevant units is initiated
- Provost reviews and approves finalized agreements
- ORIED obtains signatures from the President and CEO of CPP Foundation
- ORIED is the custodian of record for agreements


