Justification for deadline: An approval of the update by February, 2024 will allow us to implement the change for Fall 2024 registration, which will occur in April 2024.

Background:

In fall 2018, the Priority Registration process

(https://academic.cpp.edu/senate/docs/aa007178sen.pdf) was re-evaluated, and at the time, the unit maximum was set to 15 units to allow for students to stay on track to meet their 30 units per academic year goal (see CPP Take 30 campaign:

https://www.cpp.edu/studentsuccess/take30/index.shtml) while also ensuring that all students were able to enroll for a full load of classes. Over time, it has become clear that the 15-unit limit is adversely impacting students in majors with a high number of courses that have lab corequisites (namely STEM students):

Example 1: Attempting to enroll in 4 courses with lecture/lab co-reqs:

Proposed referral:

Increase the priority registration unit limit to 16 units. This aligns with the unit limits for

all general registration unit limits (except graduating seniors).

Discussion:

The Academic Affairs Committee discussed this referral in Fall 2023 and received further consultation feedback at the start of Spring 2024.

We consulted with constituents, the Registrar's Office, Office of Student Success, Equity, & Innovation, and Academic Programs (Connie Kuang, Cecilia Santiago-González, Erin DeRosa, and Keith Forward). The Committee also consulted with all Department Chairs and representatives from Student Success Centers for every college.

Feedback for this referral so far has been 100% positive. Some departments felt this hasn't been an issue but could still be beneficial, while others noted that the 1-unit difference has caused a burden on students and results in extra work for Department Chairs, faculty advisors, and Student Success advisors; therefore, this referral will make registration more flexible for students and remove unnecessary delays (even for graduation).

Based on feedback, students in degrees with labs will benefit the most; however, other program representatives noted that their students who take fewer labs or have a wide variety of course units in their program will also benefit, especially when planning to take GE classes.

Recommendations: The Academic Affairs committee recommends approval of this referral to update the priority registration unit limit cap from 15 to 16 units.
