Budget Committee Report October 2023

The budget committee met with Jared Ceja (CEO) and Joanne Mathew (C) from Foundation on October 11, 2023.

CPP Enterprises (aka, Foundation) Budget Meeting Overview:

- Limits University and CSU liability
- · Completely self-supporting and generates funds for the university,
- The Foundation plays a critical role in student success by supporting a variety of oncampus services,
 - Grant Expenditures of \$15 million (Federal), \$2 million (State and local government), \$1 million (For-Profit Organizations
 - student employment and internships (~1100 students employed with \$6 million payroll),
 - Direct Scholarships (~\$50K) and regalia waiver (~\$7.5K), and Instant Access Complete Subsidy (~\$25K)
 - Designated gift to the university (~\$1.85 million this year)
 - Reimbursements to the university (~\$11 million) for building and grounds maintenance, bond payments, utilities, revenue share, etc.
 - o grant post-award subsidies (~\$1.2 million for 2022-2023)
 - 2017 analysis @~11% actual cost
 - Receive 4.5%
- The expected 2023-2024 budget revenues are ~60 million with an unrestricted surplus of \$2.14 million,
- The pandemic was a challenge. Deficits of ~6 million deficit for 2020 and 2021 as much of the campus was shut down. Net income up to 3.16 million in 2022 with campus open again.
