Enrollment Updates



Enrollment Goal for CY 2025–26

Cal Poly Pomona is projected to slightly exceed the CY 2025–26 enrollment goal, driven by multiple contributing factors:

- Average Unit Load exceeds projection
Projected: 12.84 | Current: 13.03 (UG: 13.50)
- Improved re-enrollment outcomes
Fewer Stop Out Eligible & Danger of Discontinuation students (YoY)
- Record spring transfer cohort
1,240+ newly enrolled transfer students

Financial Impact

- \$1.8M in permanent CSU reallocation funding

New searches in 2026-2027 for hire in 2027-2028

24 allocated to the colleges based on growth

Research and Innovation

Federal Grants

- The 15% IDC cap is no longer viable for NIH and NSF
- Congressional budgets maintain the current IDC process
- Any changes to IDC are 2 years away
- Budgets in Congressional bills flat fund most agencies from last year

Expenditures and IDC recovered this year so far

Total Expenditures	\$13,194,481	\$11,132,873
Indirect Cost Revenue	\$1,770,309	\$1,586,059

Career Engagement In and Out of the Classroom

- **Career Success Markers Expansion**

- **Career Champions**
 - Opportunity to support a collaborative community of career champions guiding students to complete career success markers and utilize the breadth of career-related resources
 - Application will open in April



- Credential students may opt in to participate through a dedicated BroncoDirect module, ensuring a seamless process.




