Enrollment Efforts to Meet CY 2025–26 Goal

Current College Year 2025-26 Enrollment Status

- Without new students in Spring, CY 2025-26 enrollment projection is 1% SHORT of our goal
- We can make it! Spring Admissions and yield are critical (\$1.8M CSU funding at risk)

Summer 2025

- Added 119 resident FTES
- Goal: **668** → Outcome: **787**

Fall 2025

- **Retention increased:** 92.8% transfers (†), 88.5% freshmen (†)
- Average Unit Load increased: 13.18 (↑ from 13.10 projected)
- Re-enrollment increased: Net increase from stop-out & at-risk student engagement
- Capacity expanded: +2,273 seats added in last 3 weeks of registration; 168 WTUs deployed for more course sections; high-demand courses targeted
- Waitlist Wizard successful: 1,558-student pilot; 36% achieve full-time, 18% reach 15+ units

Spring 2025 - Next Critical Phase

- Applications increased: +24% year-over-year
- Need ~540-625 new transfers
- Yield performance will determine final goal attainment



Outreach: Targeted Spring Transfer Efforts

- Offered on-the-spot admission to CSU eligible transfers applying to non-impacted programs
- First time CPP has participated in guaranteed admission
- Collaborative effort across Admissions, Financial Aid, IT,
 PolyTransfer, StratComm and OREP
- Events were held at 11 community colleges plus 2 virtual sessions
- Students received:
 - Certificate of admission
 - Application and financial aid support
 - Personalized advising





Academic Programs: GE Updates

- New GE course proposals are now open for inclusion in the 26-27 catalog
 - Area 6 proposals require consultation with the Ethnic Studies Faculty
 Implementation Committee (ESFIC) ahead of submission
 - Former Area E courses should be proposed as new courses

- GE Recertification is underway
 - January 26, 2026, deadline to the Office of Academic Programs

FY 24/25 Official Numbers:

192 proposals submitted, 166 awards received for \$35.8M

Highlights

- Ali Sharbat (Civil Engineering) \$4.5M from LA County Safe Clean Water Program
- Shokoufeh Mirzaei (Industrial & Manufacturing Engineering) \$7.5M from NSF-CREST

Federal Funding Challenges

HSI programs – likely will be discontinued at all federal agencies, including ED, NSF, USDA, NASA, DOE/NNSA, HHS/NIH, and DoD

Three Dept of Ed (ED) grants terminated recently - \$5.8M in lost funding

Indirect Costs – we continue to use our federally-negotiated rate awaiting congressional action
