Adjustments: Crisis Response

- Increase in cases
 - 9 cases in 09-10
 - 22 cases in 10-11

OPERATIONAL CHANGES

- Need for improved coordinated response
 - During Crisis CAPS, Police, JA
 - Cohesive collaboration
 - Re-entry process
 - Well defined roles between CAPS and JA

Adjustments: Greek Hazing

- Increase in Greek Hazing
 - 1 case in 09-10
 - 3 cases in 10-11

OPERATIONAL CHANGES

- Streamline investigation process
 - Designate timeframe for interviews
- Hazing Audit
 - Every Greek organization completed
- National Hazing Prevention Week
 - Greek Life coordinated the event
 - Education
