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ASSESSMENT GOAL

- Assess the myths surrounding hazing and learning resulting from providing education and resources to support anti-hazing initiatives in the Greek community

METHODS/IMPLEMENTATION

PLAN

- The week consisted of:
 - Pre & Post Test
 - Educational Speaker
 - Bystander Intervention
 - Unless a Death Occurs documentary movie
 - Panel Discussion

DIVISION LEARNING OUTCOME

- **Social & Civic Engagement** - Students who participate in Student Affairs programs and activities will demonstrate a commitment to developing awareness and addressing the social issues and needs of their various communities, including the university, through meaningful involvement

PROGRAM LEARNING OUTCOME

- Measure the understanding of all Greek Council affiliated organizations on the definition of hazing and activities that constitute hazing.

METHODS/IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

- Greek students were given a pre-test and a post-test assessing their knowledge of hazing.
- Using Student Voice (Campus Labs), we emailed the students the pre and post tests.

ASSESSMENT RESULTS

- About 900 Greek Students in Fall 2011
- Pre-test 624 respondents (69% of total Greeks)
- Post-test 510 respondents (57% of total Greeks & 82% of Pre-Test respondents)

ASSESSMENT RESULTS

79% of respondents on the pre-test and 92% of respondents on the post-test thought hazing *is not* an effective way to teach respect and develop discipline. This was a 13% increase from the pre to post test results.

ASSESSMENT RESULTS

90% of respondents on the pre-test and 97% of respondents on the post-test answered that if someone agrees to participate in an activity, it can be considered hazing.

ASSESSMENT RESULTS

As a result of the Hazing Prevention Week efforts, there was an 8% *increased* awareness of utilizing the hazing hotline.

ASSESSMENT RESULTS

On both the pre and post test, 20% of the respondents were not able to identify the factors used to determine if an activity is considered hazing.

RECOMMENDATIONS/CONCLUSIONS

- During our summer retreats OSLCC will look at creating a plan that focuses on changing behaviors surrounding hazing within the clubs/organizations.

RECOMMENDATIONS/CONCLUSIONS

- Work closer with Judicial Affairs to develop Hazing Prevention educational tools.
- Focus education on areas where students showed the most resistance to change.

RECOMMENDATIONS/CONCLUSIONS

- Incorporate hazing education into the re-chartering workshops for all clubs/organizations
- Linked stophazing.com to the OSLCC clubs/organizations and Greek life webpages
