#### Course Objectives

Create Critical Awareness prior to, during, and at the conclusion of an active shooter event.

Give Students/Faculty ability to properly practice for an active shooter event on campus Run, Hide, Fight

#### What is an active shooter?

An active Shooter is somebody with a gun trying to kill people in a confined populated area.

#### General Findings

- Most occur in small to medium towns
- Most perpetrators are male, single shooters
- Shooters tend to stop their actions when they see or hear law enforcement or confronted by an authority figure.
- Average time of an active shooter event is 12 minutes
- While the likelihood is low the risk is real. Active shooter events are occurring in an increased frequency in college campuses and elsewhere

#### Statistics

- 1966: University of Texas, Austin - Widely considered the first active shooter event
- 1999: Columbine, Colorado - High School Shooting
- 2007: Virginia Tech - University Shooting
- 2012: Sandy Hook - Elementary School
- 2018: Parkland, Florida - High School
- 2022: Uvalde, Texas - Elementary School

### Pre-event Indicators

- There is no one “profile” of an active shooter suspect.
- Often know their targets/victims
- Some indicators might include:
  - a) Personal grievances
  - b) Contextually inappropriate recent acquisition of weapons
  - c) Contextually inappropriate and recent escalation of target practice
  - d) Writing about acts of violence (social media, notes, verbal)

### Survival Strategies

#### RUN

- Sounds like gunfire. Don't wait for reassurance (ex. people screaming, running)
- Fast and safe egress locations. Anything is an exit (window, “Closed” doors).
- Movement strategies (zig zag, or run straight)
- Leave personal property behind, if you must bring something bring your phone. MOST important thing is your life.
- Be ready to transition from running to fighting if necessary

#### HIDE

- Cover vs concealment
- Staying silent and unseen
- Ability to barricade entrance/exit (make yourself a hard target). He can't see you; he might go elsewhere.
- Know your surroundings/geography
- How to barricade yourself?

#### FIGHT

Improvised weapons

Solo and group tactics

Disruption of attacker's plans.

Survivor mindset

Action with total commitment
