Annual Security Report

Cal Poly Pomona's Annual Security Report, published in compliance with the Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act (Clery Act), is available on the [Cal Poly Pomona Annual Security Report webpage](#). While the Campus Hazing Transparency Report documents findings of institutional hazing policy violations by recognized student organizations regardless of where the hazing occurred, the Annual Security Report documents reports of alleged Clery-defined hazing occurring in Clery geography. Given that the Annual Security Report and Campus Hazing Transparency Report are based on different reporting requirements and document different types of hazing incidents, the data in the two reports may differ.
