


CLIMATE ACTION

As part of our Carbon Commitment through Second Nature, the reporting agency formally known as the American College & University Presidents' Climate Commitment (ACUPCC), a greenhouse gas (GHG) inventory is completed annually to compare our current carbon emissions to 2006 baseline emissions.



Scope 1 covers emissions from sources owned by the campus, such as fleet vehicles, equipment and building use. Scope 2 covers emissions generated from electricity, heat or steam. Scope 3 covers emissions from sources not owned or controlled by the university like commuting and air travel.

The pie chart shows a typical annual inventory breakdown. Due to the pandemic, 2020 saw a drop of emission that are abnormally low. The graph above depicts the in emissions over time and the sudden drop in 2020 was largely due to remote learning and working.



OPERATIONS

Food Waste and Composting

Beginning in January 2022, the campus was required by SB 1383 to provide organic waste collection. This necessitated campus housing and food service locations to increase food waste recovery efforts. The legislation is part of California's efforts to reduce short-lived climate pollution.

The Office of Sustainability, Custodial Services, College of Agriculture and Foundation Dining worked to conduct a CalRecycle Food Waste Study of the Farmstore and Innovation Brew Works.

The waste characterization study helped the campus right-size the existing bins and replace a trash dumpster with a food waste dumpster.

The Student Sustainability Coalition secured TGIF (The Green Initiative Fund) funds to acquire food composting bins at the University Village Apartments. The program allows students to place food waste into specified bins which are then taken to the Center for Regenerative Studies for composting. The compost is then used for growing produce at the Poly Pantry.
