#### ABOUT DR. CHEN

A native of Taiwan, Tai-Cheng Chen began playing the piano at the age of six; by the time he was nine, he had won his first piano competition in Taipei. Within the next two years, he placed first in a national Taiwanese piano competition and performed Mozart's piano concerto with the Taiwan Symphony Orchestra. At fifteen, he moved to Austria to attend the Vienna Musikhochschule. At age nineteen he not only took first prize in its internal piano competition, but also completed the school's rigorous Concert Artist program—graduating with its highest honor of Unanimous Distinction. In the following year he won the prestigious Vienna International Music Festival Competition, in a performance that was televised throughout the world.

Thereafter, Tai-Cheng Chen moved to New York to attend The Juilliard School. While attending Juilliard, he won the Gina Bachauer Scholarship Award and the opportunity to play Bartok's Third Piano Concerto with the Juilliard Philharmonic Orchestra. Shortly after earning his DMA degree from Juilliard, he returned to Taiwan to teach at Taipei National University of the Arts.

Tai-Cheng Chen has given numerous international performances, including such venues as Lincoln Center, Carnegie Recital Hall in New York, and the Grosser Musikverein Saal in Vienna. As Professor of Music, Dr. Chen has inspired generations of students, many of whom have gone on to win national and international competitions.
