Majority of applicants to undergraduate programs at Cal Poly Pomona were California residents (96%). Half of the fall incoming class was comprised of transfer students.



Housing

University Housing Services offers three living communities – Residential Halls, Residential Suites, and the Lyle Center for Regenerative Studies. 44% of full-time freshmen lived on campus during fall 2018. Overall, 90% of undergraduate students live off campus.

Faculty

There were a total of 1,311 faculty, of which 47% were fulltime.

The student to faculty ratio was 25 to 1.

Alumni

There are more than 149,000 alumni⁴ and over 161,000 degrees awarded since 1956. Recent alumni have earned graduate degrees at CSU campuses (such as Pomona, Fullerton, Long Beach, Los Angeles, Northridge, San Diego), USC, Azusa Pacific, UCLA, UC Irvine, and University of Redlands.

Tuition & Aid

Tuition and fees for full time undergraduate study was \$7,353 for the 2018-19 academic year.

Over \$219 million in student aid was given though grants, loans, federal work study, and scholarships in 2017-18⁵.
