

Fields of Study

CPP offers 54 undergraduate programs, 31 graduate programs and 1 doctorate program. Forty percent of the student body were STEM majors. The top enrolled programs include mechanical engineering, psychology, civil engineering, computer science, and marketing management.

Housing

University Housing Services offers four living communities – Residential Halls, Traditional Halls, Residential Suites, and the Lyle Center for Regenerative Studies. 24% of first-time freshmen live in campus residential housing during fall 2021. Overall, the majority (89%) of undergraduate students live off campus.

Faculty

There were a total of 1,512 faculty, of which 46% were fulltime.

The student to faculty ratio was 40 to 1.

Alumni

There are more than 149,000 alumni³ and over 172,000 degrees awarded since 1956. Recent alumni⁴ have earned graduate degrees at CSU campuses (such as Fullerton and Long Beach) USC, Azusa Pacific University, University of La Verne, UCLA, UC Irvine, National University, and California Baptist University.

Tuition & Aid^{5,6}

Tuition and fees for full time undergraduate study for California residents were \$7,438 per semester for the 2021-22 academic year.

Over an estimated \$235 million in student aid was given through grants, loans, federal work study, and scholarships in 2020-2021.
