

## Notice of Mandatory Water Conservation Regulation Effective August 1, 2014

## To The Campus Community:

The purpose of this notice is to advise you of an important new regulation recently passed by the State of California which will immediately impact your water use.

The purpose of the regulation is to reduce unnecessary water use while maintaining public health and safety needs for water consumers.

The regulation takes effect on August 1, 2014, and must be followed by all California water consumers, including those at Cal Poly Pomona.

It is now prohibited to use potable water for the following unless it is to address an immediate health and safety need, or to comply with a term or condition in a permit issued by a state or federal agency:

- 1. Washing down sidewalks and driveways.
- 2. Watering outdoor landscapes in a manner that causes runoff such that water flows onto adjacent property, non-irrigated areas, private and public walkways, roadways, parking lots, or structures.
- 3. Using a hose to wash a motor vehicle, unless the hose is fitted with a shut-off nozzle or other device which stops water flow when not in use.
- 4. Operating a fountain or other decorative water feature, unless the water is part of a recirculating system.
