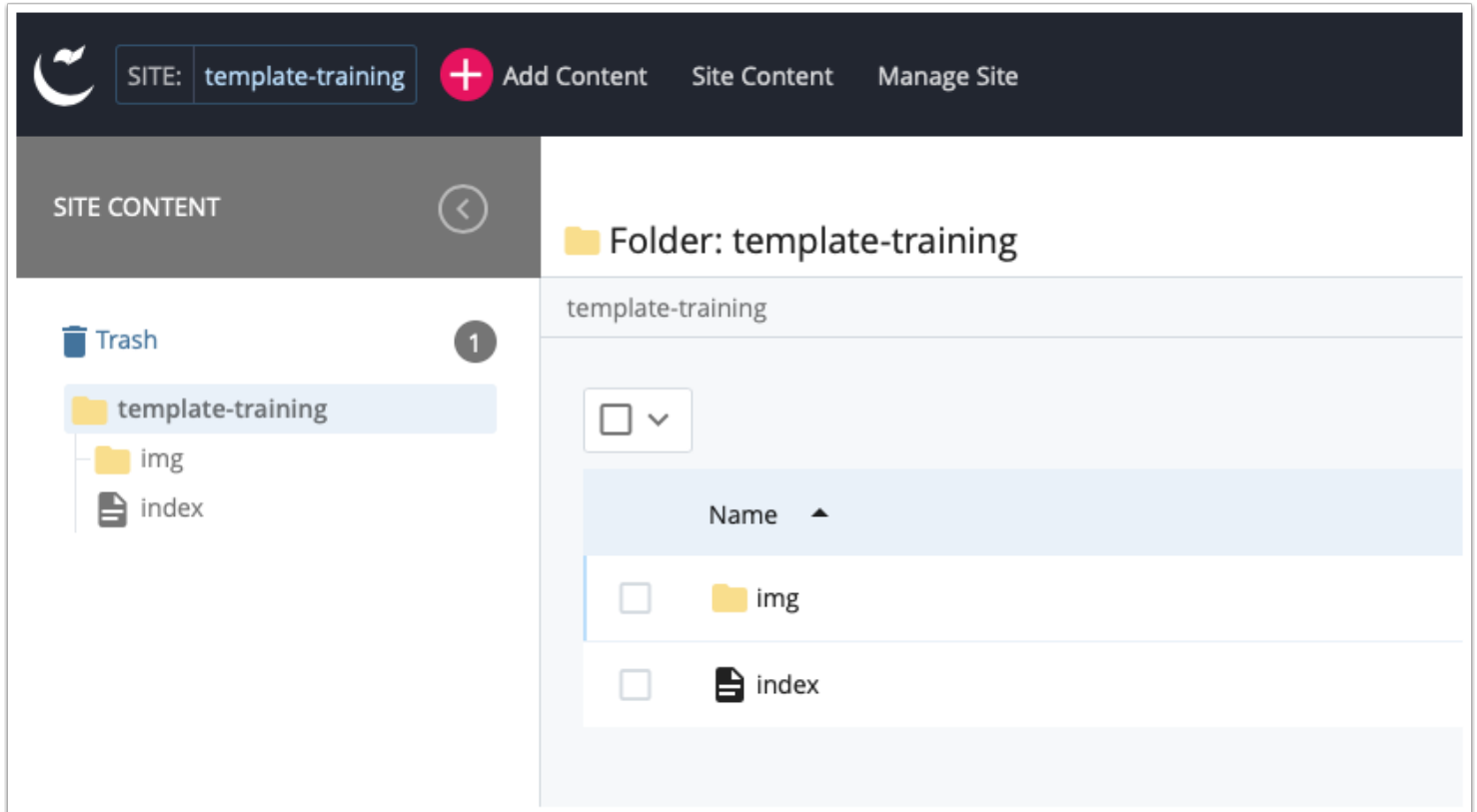


Starting Your Webpage

Site Structure

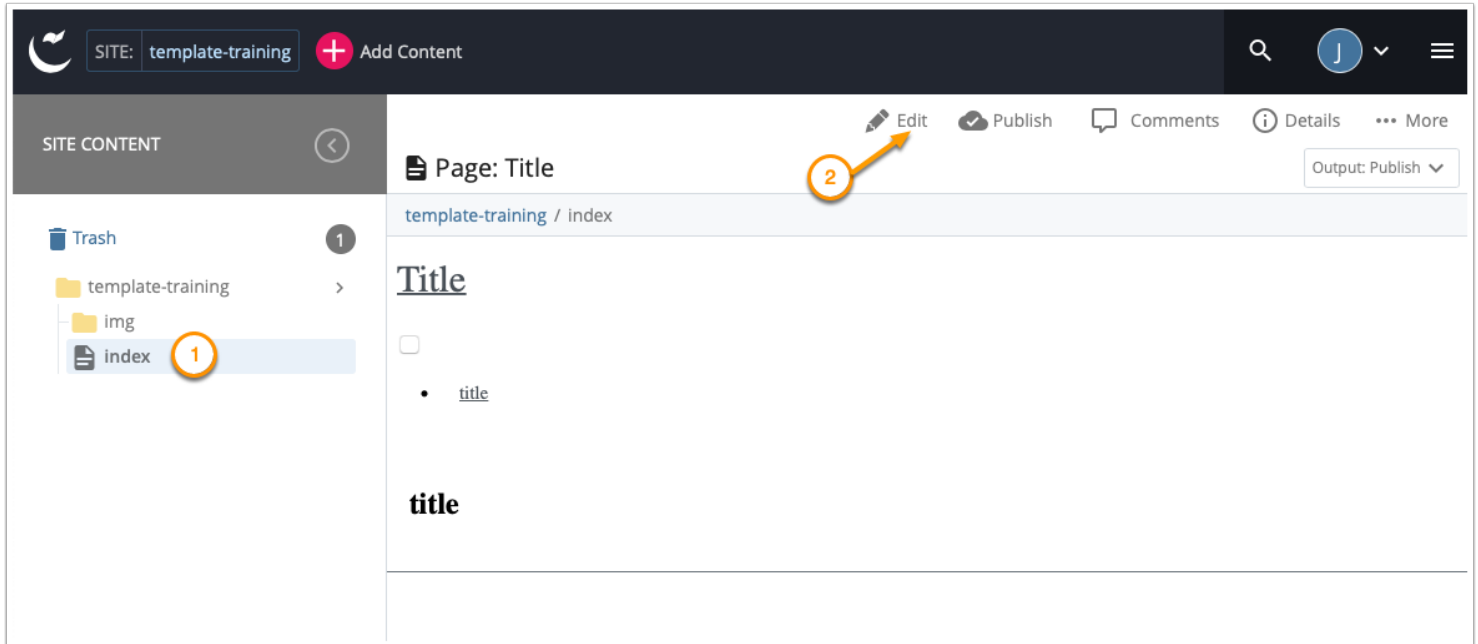
When your site is created you will see that you have an index file. This is your website's main page. You will also see an image folder. This is the location you should upload all of your images.

Editing the Index


To start editing your site click on the index page (1) in the left menu and then click on edit in the center content section (2).

Title and Description

The first section of the template is for a page title and description. This is very important. The title reflects the name of your website and will show in search results. The description summarizes the content of your site and will show up in search results also. A sample google search result for Cal Poly Pomona is shown below.
