



In 1925, cereal magnate Will Keith Kellogg purchased a 377-acre ranch in Southern California’s Pomona Valley, with the intention of breeding the finest Arabians in North America.

Kellogg was a promoter of the Arabian – a light horse breed, cherished for its intelligence, versatility, endurance and beauty – to the American public. In 1926, he began Sunday Shows, attracting large crowds and Hollywood celebrities. The horses also were featured in popular Hollywood films and movie star publicity photos.

Based on the success of Kellogg’s Arabian Horse Ranch, he continued to expand and ultimately donated 813 acres to the State of California in 1932. He also stipulated that the breeding program continue. Over time, the property was transferred to the California State Polytechnic College, Kellogg-Voorhis, then a part of Cal Poly San Luis Obispo. Cal Poly Pomona became an independent campus in 1966.

Today the W.K. Kellogg Arabian Horse Center is a breeding industry leader, promoting the beauty and characteristics of this majestic animal. The Center is committed to advancing education and research using the Arabian horses that are known for their high-intelligence, willingness, courage, curiosity and sociality. This unique program not only continues the legacy of W.K. Kellogg, but is a commitment to Cal Poly Pomona’s “learn-by-doing” philosophy.
