2023–24 RAMP GRANT APPLICATION

The RAMP Grant is an opportunity for eligible participants to supplement their Pell Grant. A limited number of grants are available. Depending on the number of submissions, it is possible that not all applicants will receive an award. To be eligible to apply, you must meet ALL of the following criteria:

- ☐ freshman or sophomore standing
- ☐ receiving a Pell Grant
- ☐ have an unmet financial need of at least \$767*
- ☐ good academic standing (by the end of fall 2023 semester)
- ☐ enrolled full-time (12 units per semester)
- ☐ no INC/W/WU in any fall 2023 courses

Please verify that you meet all of the above criteria before you submit your application.

**If you have an unmet need of less than \$767, you may be able to adjust your budget or reduce your loan to qualify. See a RAMP staff member for further information.*

Carefully read the application instructions. There are several required activities and an essay prompt. **You cannot apply without completing all of the requirements.** You have until the deadline to complete the requirements. If you have any questions, email your RAMP Advisor.

ESSAY

Social media can be ubiquitous in our everyday lives. It can serve as a tool, resource, or method for staying connected. On the other hand, it can be a distraction or source of negativity. Describe your perspective on and experience with social media. Explain how social media impacts your life and the broader society, both positively and negatively. If you don't use social media, please share your reasons for not engaging in social media, what other tools or resources you use instead, and address the rest of the prompt.

Once you have drafted your essay, make an appointment with the Writing Center or EOP to have it reviewed. Be sure to get a stamp or signature as proof of attending the appointment and submit it with your application. Revise your essay based on the feedback you receive. Essays that demonstrate substantive revision beyond the first draft will receive higher scores. Your final essay needs to be approximately 300-500 words, double-spaced with one-inch margins and 12-point Times New Roman font.

Your essay will be scored based on the following criteria: 1) adequately addresses the prompt; 2) expresses ideas in a thoughtful, fully developed manner; 3) attended Writing Center or EOP tutoring and demonstrated effort in revision; and 4) followed the specified format.

In addition to your essay, your fall GPA and number of no shows from RAMP tutorial sessions will be factored into your final application score.
