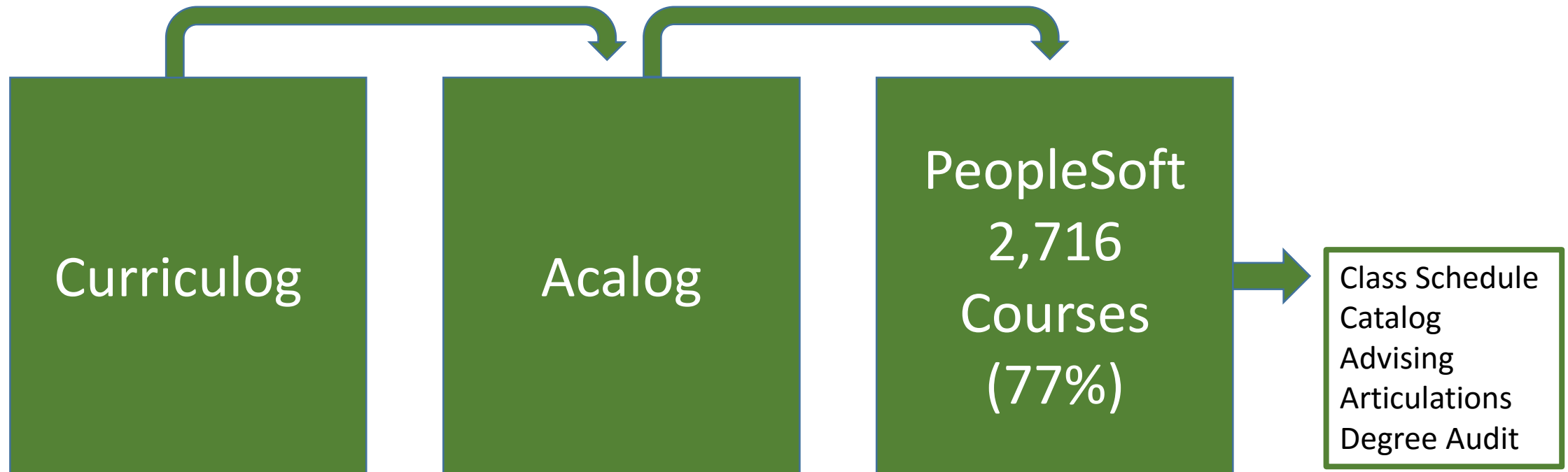

- **Key Milestones**

- Curriculog
 - **10/4/2017**: All responses are expected from departments
- PeopleSoft
 - **10/30/2017**: All courses will be in PeopleSoft and available in MyPlanner
- Conversion Guides
 - **11/1/2017**: Conversion guides available to students and advisors
- First semester class schedule
 - **11/1/2017**: Start building the Fall 2018 and Spring 2019 class schedules

- Assessment of Academic Preparation and Placement in First-Year General Education Written Communication and Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning Courses
- Effective Fall 2018

EO 1100 – General Education

- **GE courses must align within the policy framework**
 - 39 lower division units; 9 upper division units
 - 48 units required
- **Faculty-led course review and redesign process**
 - Area B4-Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning
 - In response to the CSU Quantitative Reasoning Report
 - Students will enroll in an academic credit course on day 1
 - CSU will no longer require ELM or EPT placement tests
 - High school standardized test scores will be used to assess academic readiness
- **Other Changes**
 - Double counting major and GE courses
 - GE courses must be taught at least once in a five-year period

EO 1110 – Academic Preparation

- **Faculty-led math course review and redesign process**
 - Area B4-Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning
 - Math pathways by discipline or major
 - Supplemental instruction, tutoring, course redesign and other strategies
 - High school standardized test scores will be used to assess academic readiness
 - Area A2-Written Communication
 - We offer stretch English pathways for incoming students
 - Exploring the use of supplemental instruction to increase student learning and outcomes
